

I will **NOT** split at the moment as this is a complete satellite working system.


This system is **PICKUP** only but may be delayed because of the current situation. Understandably.

EXAM SECRETARY REPORT

We have had a lot of interest in the Foundation licence exam recently. People who probably considered getting licensed in the past must be thinking this is a golden opportunity to take advantage of



some free time during lockdown, and have been asking what is required. As you may be aware, we don't run exam courses at the club, candidates are expected to buy the RSGB Foundation Licence course book which can be obtained from:-

and self-study. The exam has a practical element which has to be assessed by the clubs official licence assessor, then once signed off by them I would normally apply to the RSGB for exam papers, followed by the exam 2 weeks later at Westleigh village hall.

Due to Corona virus restrictions this has now changed, and has actually made things much easier. The practical element

has now been suspended until further notice, so all that is required is sitting an online exam in your own home. What the candidate is expected to do is buy the book and self-study, then contact the RSGB exams department directly to agree on a date for the exam. You will need a Windows 10 computer and a Google Chrome browser, or a Mac running OS 10.8+ and a Safari browser, webcam, microphone and speakers, and of course a reliable internet connection! Before the exam, the RSGB will email the candidate a link to access the TestReach website, and a password. You will be expected to visit the site in advance of the exam and take the tutorial. Invigilating will also be done online. After the exam you will have instant notification of a pass or fail (followed by official confirmation in the post). For more information, see the link below.

Intermediate and Full licence exams are suspended at the moment, but they are looking into including them if present restrictions continue. For further information, go to:-
