There was a wonderful attendance on the night including several xyls which added to the party spirit.




A big thank you to everyone who brought Raffle Prizes and food and to John (G3JKL) for organizing some Xmas music.



INFORMATION ON UTC - TAI

NO leap second will be introduced at the end of June 2016. The difference between Coordinated Universal Time UTC and the International Atomic Time TAI is :- from 2016 January 1, 0h UTC, until further notice : UTC-TAI = -36 s

Leap seconds can be introduced in UTC at the end of the months of December or June, depending on the evolution of UT1-TAI. Bulletin C is mailed every six months, either to announce a time step in UTC, or to confirm that there will be no time step at the next possible date.
