FURTHER NOTES ON USING LOG4OM LOGGER

Finally I have included a short article written by yours truly for any members who have adopted Log4OM as their logging program and like me have ended up using the wrong Configuration and/or Database to store contacts made!

HOW TO MOVE AND EDIT ENTRIES STORED IN THE WRONG DATABASE

by Terry (G4CHD)

Before using Log4OM whether eg in the Main shack or Portable, one should check that the correct Configuration (Profile) and Database have been selected (assuming that you have set up different options for these). However, despite these words of wisdom, inevitably like me, you may end up using the wrong Database and maybe the wrong Configuration. Since the Configuration specifies eg your Station Callsign, My Rig, My Antenna etc then possibly the wrong details may also have been stored in the wrong Database!

This short article it is hoped will be useful to any members who have adopted Log4OM as their Logger program, and attempts to describe how to transfer erroneously entered contacts into the correct Database and once there, how to edit incorrect details such as Station Callsign etc.

MOVING ENTRIES FROM ONE DATABASE TO ANOTHER

Since we need to move a block of entries then the best approach is to use the Archive Management icon (green book 3rd icon from left towards the top of the log page).

When the QSO Archive window opens, click on the Date range box and enter the Start and End dates of the erroneous entries. Now click on Search and highlight the erroneous entries. Now click on the \checkmark ADIF tab, click Select and choose a folder and file name for the file, and click save. Finally click on Export ADIF file and when Write ADIF file goes green, close this and the QSO Archive windows.

Next, this file will be used to import these contacts into the correct Database.

Change to the required correct Database using File\Open Database\ and select followed by Open.

To import the required contacts previously saved as above, from the main display window use File\Import ADIF\ select the required file followed by Open. Now click on the Import ADIF File button in the new window and when successfully imported click OK and close. Refresh the Logbook display, and the required

contacts should now be appear included. If all is OK, reload the earlier wrongly used Database and delete the erroneously entered contacts.

However, as stated earlier, some of the Database fields may need to be edited as described next.

EDITING DATABASE FIELDS

Although the Station Callsign can be edited contact by contact by double clicking the required contact entry in the Logbook and editing the Station Callsign accordingly, it is more convenient to edit all the erroneous contacts as a block for eg Station Callsign, My Rig, My Antenna etc.

This is also done using the Archive Management tab (green book - 3rd tab from left) and as before locate and highlight the required erroneous entries. Then click on the Field Update tab and in the Massive QSO update window, use the drop down menu to select the Field to Update eg Station Callsign. Enter the required entry in the Value box eg G4CHD/P and click on UPDATE button. When done, click OK and repeat for any other fields that need editing and finally close windows and return to the main display.

Refresh the Loglist and confirm that the new entries have appeared corrected and hopefully voila - problem solved!
