

TOM WARD (G2FKO)

Many thanks to John (G3JKL) who received the following fascinating information re Tom Ward, the original holder of our Club Callsign, G2FKO.

Hi G3JKL,

Looking around on internet I came across information relative to your club and thought I would drop you a line or two.

Back in the early

Back in the early 1960's I was Tom's closest friend and he was also my boss as we both worked for the SWEB power company - he was the District Engineer and at that time and I was his assistant. Apart from working closely together we were both



radio amateurs - my call was and still is G3MWM. We were in touch by radio from the various locations in Africa, Switzerland, Libya, Australia, and Brazil where I both lived and worked as Director of Electrical Power Authorities from which I am now retired and living on my own farm here in the south of Brazil.



My last communication with Tom was in 1973 - he was still living in Clovelly Rd at that time, and both he and his family were very dear to me and from that time on I lost all contact.

I used to live in a bungalow at 88 Clifton Street, East of the Water and we played around on 160m, 2m and 70cm across town from his home to mine. The date of my last communication with Tom was 5th August 1986 on the 20m band - he was using a simple dipole antenna at that time and mentioned to me that he was 77 years old and that the new bridge over the river was only half finished. The 1974 qso was from my station in Hong Kong - I was VS6AM at that time. Bill Yeo (G2CVY) in Barnstable was another old friend of ours and was in the same qso.

It is very touching that his call lives on associated with your Club.

You can find me on QRZ.COM - my call being PY5ZBU, plus lots of info on the internet by typing in my call. I would like to be in some way associated with your club. Best wishes and please excuse me for rambling on!!! Don Murden (PY5ZBU)
