REPORT ON THE APRIL MEETING


Rectangular Loop Antenna with a Twist

Starting from the basic dipole and high voltages at its ends leading to coronal discharge, the Quad Loop antenna evolved from a religious station high up in the Andes. This full wave Quad was analysed using MMANA as was then the 2 wavelength Quad.

The high SWR was then addressed by distorting the Quad to a rectangular shape and finally to bring opposite antenna side currents in phase, one was twisted through 180 degs.



This final design was optimised for best SWR/Gain using MMANA and finally demonstrated on 2m with a contact with John (G3JKL) at his home QTH as he was unable to attend the Meeting due to being unwell.

Members present appeared to enjoy the talk which I have to say I thoroughly enjoyed preparing and presenting.


