
REPORT ON THE OCTOBER MEETING

IAN (G4RVG) - SILENT KEY - A TRIBUTE

My thanks to Steve's G6SQX xyl Annie for the following:-

We have recently lost a good friend - Ian Binding (G4RVG) who had an interest in and supported all aspects of Amateur Radio.

Ian grew up in Exeter during the war and after leaving school was apprenticed as an electrician. Ian was always a keen sportsman and first met his wife Edna, a student nurse at the time, whilst involved with the Exmouth rowing club. He was a passionate swimmer and table tennis player which he continued until recently. Ian's experience in the army during National Service gave him experience as a medic in Germany and he and Edna were volunteers with the St John ambulance service for many years.

Ian got a job with the South Western Electricity Board (SWEB) and was involved with various aspects of the Board's work including domestic installations and laterly in the shop in South Molton.

Ian and Edna moved to South Molton in the 60's where they had a bungalow built in Parklands where they brought up their five children.

Edna was a senior nurse at the cottage hospital until retirement.

Ian's interest in Amateur radio took off in 1970s when there was a large group of like minded enthusiasts in the area who set about forming the Exmoor Radio Club and who were very active in competitions often operating from Sandyway and other locations on Exmoor and orgnising training for aspiring "HAMs". At that time the morse tests were carried out at the Ilfracombe Ship to Shore Station with it still being used professionally at sea.

Radio amateurs were also involved and sponsored by the local authorities at the time as part of the cold war civil contingency planning which led to the formation of the RAYNET groups. Ian headed up the North Devon group for many years providing communications for many community events including the Exmoor Youth Challenge which the Exmoor Radio Club continues to support. Ian had a wide interest in the hobby and kept abreast of developments embracing computors and digital modes and was keen to listen into the recent link between the ISS and Bampton primary school.



As an enthusiastic and an essential part of our Sunday morning topband net he will be much missed by all of us...


